135 & Beyond: Mid-Project Report #2

Project Overview

In 2026, the YMCA of Northern Rock County will celebrate its 135th anniversary with 135 & Beyond. This strategic initiative bridges our rich history with future-focused facility and program enhancements at the Janesville and Parker YMCAs. During the over 13 targeted in-person Reshaping Sessions from May 20 through June 26, more than 150 residents, members, and partner stakeholders contributed ideas on amenities, accessibility, and community connections.

Background & Objectives

The 135 & Beyond Project launched in May 2025 to engage our community in determining updates that reflect evolving membership needs and local priorities. Phase One focused on facilitated, face-to-face workshops to surface facility improvements, program innovations, and partnership opportunities. In Phase Two, we will broaden participation through an online feedback period to refine concepts and recruit the 135 Community Team of ambassadors and advocates.

Community Needs

- Year-round food programs: greenhouse, community garden, industrial kitchen
- Expanded autism services via school partnerships
- Combating loneliness: Sunday services and peer support
- Youth inclusion: multi-age sports, ninja courses, gymnastics spaces
- Accessibility: ADA upgrades, elevators, parking solutions

Excitement & Innovation

- Inclusion Coffee: café operated by autistic participants
- Senior housing partnerships on Y properties
- Data-driven storytelling: meals served, participation metrics

Concerns & Priorities

- Retaining Special Olympics access at B&G Club
- Consistent, comprehensive facility tours
- Stable funding for childcare and program quality
- Preservation of historic Y signage and spaces

Essential Facilities & Additions

- Aquatic upgrades in Janesville: lap, deep-water, zero-depth entry
- Family-friendly scheduling: simultaneous child programming
- Community hubs: meeting rooms, teen adventure spaces
- Pool at Parker YMCA
