YMCA OF NORTHERN ROCK COUNTY INVITES COMMUNITY TO SHARE IDEAS IN ONLINE PUBLIC SURVEY

Residents and non-members can submit feedback through September 12 as part of the 135 & Beyond Project

JANESVILLE, Wis., July 28, 2025 — The YMCA of Northern Rock County has opened a public listening survey for its 135 & Beyond Project, an effort to chart the organization's course as it approaches its 135th anniversary in 2026. The survey remains available through September 12 at www.ymcanrc.org/135years and invites all Rock County residents, including non-members, to watch a short video and share their ideas online.

Launched earlier this year, the 135 & Beyond Project engages the community in shaping facility improvements, program innovation, and partnership opportunities.

Between May 20 and June 26, 13 in-person Reshaping Sessions drew more than 150 residents, YMCA members and staff, business leaders, and partner stakeholders. Participants offered feedback on amenities, accessibility, and community connections.

Conversation highlights included year-round food assistance, a community garden, stable childcare funding, historic-space preservation, aquatic upgrades, expanded youth sports, and family-friendly scheduling. In fall 2025, online survey results will be combined with earlier gathered feedback, professional assessments, and feasibility studies. A 135 Community Team, comprising volunteers, Y staff, members, and community partners, will then form to draft recommendations to share with the Board, helping to shape and refine the Y's next chapter.
